The 'County Deal' Update – Councillors were offered an opportunity to put questions directly to Michael Gove, MP which confirmed that a deal would require a directly elected County Leader; the likely time frame for election and implementation is 2025. Neighbouring counties Norfolk and Essex have signed the same provisional agreement and we are working closely with them. Details and public consultation are planned before debate and a decision at full council.

Council Budget 2023/ 24 - the budget was passed by Council on 9th February. Overall expenditure will rise by 9.6% from £625.3m to £685.3m. Additional funds come from a 3.99% increase in Council Tax (1.99% general Council Tax and 2.00% dedicated to adult social care). Council taxes per household rise by:

Band B property: total £22.32 per week (85 pence per week increase from 2022-23)
Band D property: total £28.70 per week (£1.10 pence per week increase from 2022-23)

Traffic Congestion around the Primary School – The problem has been brought to my attention and a meeting is planned next week with County Highways to assess options.

Suffolk Fire and Rescue Service inspection rated "Good" - An independent inspection was undertaken last spring when inspectors conducted a comprehensive review of Suffolk Fire and Rescue Service, a report published on 20 January praised many aspects of the Service. The Council 2023-24 budget allocates £5.3m for fleet replacement, including purchase of 20 new fire engines.
